TO HELP US REMEMBER: *Young ones:* Matthew 10:30-31 “And even the very hairs of your head are numbered. So don’t be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.”
Older ones: Matthew 9:37b-38 “The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.”

TEEN THOUGHT:

A lot of people are quick to remember that Jesus said, “Do not judge, or you too will be judged” to support their view of an all-tolerant God. While Jesus has unlimited patience (1 Timothy 1:16), this passage of scripture warns that Jesus did not come simply to bring peace, but that he will disown, and we should be afraid of the One who can destroy both body and soul in hell. How can we match up these differing messages of Jesus? How can we be the workers that take this message to the harvest field? What type of reception will we receive?

TIPS FOR TEACHING

Some topics for potential study – some of the scriptures below support these.

1. How to spread the gospel of Christ – what have you seen work effectively?
2. Do not be afraid... of “them”. What does it mean to “fear” the Lord?
3. While this passage may question us how we can do more, Jesus reminds us that he wants most from us is to acknowledge him, receive him, own him, and love him. How do these relate and differ?
